9. CONSIDERATION OF MOTIONS OF EXIGENCY (IF ANY)

1. Cllr S Tebele submitted a motion of exigency pertaining to the riots which are currently occurring in Kleinmond and Pearly Beach and which marches have to be dealt with urgently. The motion may support the finding of a speedy solution in order to curb damages and people getting hurt.

The Speaker recognised the urgency of the motion.

When Cllr S Tebele mentioned that people from Kleinmond were called 'animals' on the Hermanus Times Facebook Page, Cllr G Cohen brought a point of order to the effect that false information was spread and that maybe Cllr Tebele was part of the march. Cllr G Cohen requested that Cllr S Tebele withdraw his words that people were saying that the Councillors were not present and have not done anything. The Speaker then ruled that, until such time that Cllr Tebele can provide him with proof that it was said on social media, he (Cllr Tebele) should retract his words. If proof was provided that it was said, the Speaker will accept it.

THE MEETING ADJOURNED AT 12:20 IN ORDER FOR CLLR S TEBELE TO FIND PROOF OF THE WORDS SAID ON SOCIAL MEDIA

THE MEETING RESUMED AT 12:30

THE MEETING WAS IMMEDIATELY ADJOURNED IN ORDER FOR THE SPEAKER TO LISTEN TO THE RECORDING TO ASCERTAIN WHICH WORDS WERE SAID BY CLLR S TEBELE

THE MEETING RESUMED AT 12:45

The Speaker then reported back to the meeting that the words said by Cllr S Tebele were in fact not the exact words said on social media and his ruling was that Cllr Tebele withdraw his words. Cllr Tebele indicated that

he will not withdraw his words and the Speaker confirmed that actions will be taken in this regard after the meeting.

Cllr S Tebele moved his motion that:

- 1. The Executive Mayor and Deputy Executive Mayor must address the Pearly Beach Community; and**
- 2. The Executive Mayor and Deputy Executive Mayor, including those councillors, must engage with the Kleinmond Community to find amicable solutions to these problems.**

The motion was seconded by Cllr X Msweli.

Cllr A Komani raised a point of order to the effect that Cllr Tebele should not refer to councillors as 'those councillors'.

Cllr S Tebele raised a point of order that he did not refer to those councillors in a disrespectful manner and the Speaker ruled that the point of order stands as the reference to 'those councillors' is indeed a reference to councillors which is not defamatory and does not diminish their position.

Cllr A Komani then continued by explaining that meetings were scheduled between councillors and the communities and raised the question where are these lies coming from.

Cllr S Kalolo then raised a point of order that Cllr A Komani withdraw his words 'I do not know where these lies come from'. The Speaker ruled that Cllr Komani's words were unjustified and that Cllr Komani must withdraw those words. Cllr Komani withdrew the words.

Cllr S Kalolo continued by trying to establish why the Executive Mayor, as political head of the Municipality, instead of the ward councillors, cannot engage with the Kleinmond community on the issue of a tender.

Cllr A Komani explained that Portfolio Heads must assist the Councillors of the Overstrand and that he did not indicate that the Executive Mayor should not engage with the communities.

THE DEMOCRATIC ALLIANCE REQUESTED A CAUCUS AT 13:05

THE MEETING RESUMED AT 13:10

The Deputy Executive Mayor, Ald D Coetzee, reported back on behalf of the Democratic Alliance and agreed that the situations in Kleinmond and

Pearly Beach are uncalled for and that the Executive Mayor has formulated a plan to address the situations in both areas. He further mentioned that Cllr S Tebele was walking around in the corridors of this building the previous day humming and singing that matters are starting to fall into place and that he does not trust him (Cllr Tebele) for that reason. He said he is not prepared to declare at this meeting what the Executive Mayor's plans are.

The Deputy Executive Mayor, Ald D Coetzee, moved a counter motion to the effect that the plans that have been formulated by the Executive Mayor for dealing with the situation and the communities of Kleinmond and Pearly Beach, be followed.

Cllr L Ntsabo brought a motion in terms of Rule 36 that the matter be put to vote.

The motion was seconded by Cllr G Cohen.

The Speaker ruled that the matter be put to vote.

WHEN PUT TO VOTE, THE MOTION BROUGHT BY CLLR L NTSABO CARRIED AND THE COUNCILLORS OF THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS INDICATED THEIR VOTE AGAINST THE MOTION

THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS REQUESTED A CAUCUS AT 13:40

THE MEETING RESUMED AT 13:45

WHEN PUT TO VOTE, 8 MEMBERS VOTED IN FAVOUR OF THE MOTION OF CLLR S TEBELE AND 17 IN FAVOUR OF THE COUNTER MOTION BY ALD D COETZEE

THE MOTION BY ALD D COETZEE WAS THUS CARRIED

RESOLVED:

that the plans that have been formulated by the Executive Mayor for dealing with the situation and the communities of Kleinmond and Pearly Beach, be followed.

2. Cllr S Tebele submitted a motion of exigency to the effect that the housing problem in Zwelihle be addressed urgently otherwise it may cause a riot.

The Speaker ruled that the motion is not urgent and that Cllr Tebele can submit an ordinary motion at a forthcoming meeting of Council.

3. Cllr V Macotha submitted a motion of exigency to the effect that the Supply Chain Management Policy should be discussed at the next Council meeting in terms of preferences.

The Speaker ruled that Cllr Macotha can submit an ordinary motion at a forthcoming meeting of Council.

Cllr S Tebele requested that it be put on record that the Speaker's decision to deny his motion was unfair as he did not listen to the substance of the motion. He further mentioned that the African National Congress distances themselves from any further riots as it will be beyond their control.
